# ZION'S ANGEL TREE



Zion's Angel Tree will take on a new format this year due to the pandemic, as we are unable to gather in person to sort and wrap gifts - usually more than 500 individual items each year - for the children served by the Hummelstown Food Pantry.

We know you miss selecting items for that certain child, so here is a little snapshot: The food pantry serves approximately 120 children at any given time. At last count, there were about 25 children under the age of 5; 10 in their late teens; and the rest about evenly split between ages 5-10 and 10-15. Perennial gift requests have been for winter clothing, pajamas and underwear, learning toys, dolls and stuffed animals, race cars, sports equipment, books, electronics, crafts, and fragrance and grooming items for boys and girls. Your donations of gift cards to mass merchandise stores will help families fulfill their children's wish lists for these popular items.

Thus we are requesting donations of \$25 gift cards to Target or Walmart, as well as packages of wrapped candy and individually packaged snacks. No need to select a tag or sign up. Due to the extraordinary circumstances this year, the Youth Advisory Committee will match your donations to ensure that all of the children served by the food pantry receive a gift card and bag of treats. Cash/check donations (payable to Zion, marked "Angel Tree") will be matched as well.
